From the Pastor's Computer:

I would like to share the newsletter article that Pastor Paul Muehlbrad wrote in the St. Mark's Messenger (Cuero).

Easter is not just a day – it's a season. It is 50 days of celebrating the resurrection of our Lord encompassing 7 Sundays until the Day of Pentecost on May 20th. Our joy is expressed in the exclamations of "Alleluia! Christ is risen. Christ is risen indeed. Alleluia!" ("Alleluia" means "praise the Lord.") It is true we celebrate the resurrected Lord every Sunday of the year, but all the 50 days of Easter rise to the greatest celebration of and in Christ.

Easter is not just a season – it's a way of life.
Remembering Christ's crucifixion and death, we are always turned toward the hope and joy of the resurrection. As Christians we live in great hope and joy.


