

Salem Lutheran Church Council Meeting April 10, 2018

Council Members in Attendance: Pastor Dan, Wanda Hahn, Cathy Hahn, Retha Hahn, Mike Rothmann, Joel Anderson, Dottie Caldwell and Lindy Cain **Devotional**- Kathy Hahn Prayer and Concerns – Sandra Ruddick is in the hospital Approval of Agenda – Retha 1st, Cathy 2nd Approval of Minutes from previous meeting – Retha 1st Cathy 2nd **Reports: Treasurer**- We are a little in the hole. ~\$2795 Pastor - Still retiring at the end of 2018 so he and Debbie bought a new house in Victoria. After doing a few repairs in the new house they will be moving to Victoria and listing their home in Port Lavaca. He stated his drive from home is only 15 minutes longer and Debbie and he will be very intentional about being "present" in Port Lavaca. Castle construction is still working on parts of the church A person is coming by on Friday, April 13, to work on adjusting the PA system **Proclaim** – Nothing this meeting Nurture – Community Vacation Bible School has been delayed for the next year. Sunday school ages very immensely and there are some discipline problems in children's church as well as Sunday school. Research is being done on a cross-generational Sunday school system where all generations get together to learn of Christ. This system is called Faith 5 — Share, Read, Talk, Pray, Bless There is a camp in Colorado to train Sunday school teachers in this program. We discussed other training which might be closer to home. Response – Need a stewardship focus to acknowledge gifts and give thanks. Property – Lighting is getting much better! We are almost finished with the walkways. A time was set for Monday, May 1st to discuss the janitorial contract for the church. Bozart will be replacing all of the locks on every building at Salem. We are switching over to a less expensive key that still keeps our facility safe and secure. Yard work-Retha will be accepting bids from lawn care companies to handle the ongoing maintenance necessary to keep our grounds looking good.

Old Business -

Special Called Congregational meeting was set for Sunday, June 10, 2018 immediately following our worship service. The agenda will include motions to rename our existing Endowment Funds and consolidate all funds into two separate new accounts. Several Constitutional amendments and By-law amendments will be presented for approval to define the two funds and establish guidelines for future bequests.

New Business -

All council members filled out a background check information sheet. Pastor Dan will be gone to the synod assembly on Sunday May 6th. Senior sending for the Calhoun High School graduates was changed from Sunday, May 27th to Sunday, May 20th because a few of the graduates had huge conflicts in their schedule on May 27th. Mike has requested information to begin the process for hiring a new pastor.

Property Team Update

This is a list of current projects and their progress that hopefully suggest that we are alive and eager to grow. If you are interested in leading and/or participating in any of these projects, please let us know.

ALMOST COMPLETE Courtyard Lighting: New dusk-to-dawn lights have been installed and are temporarily hooked up. Permanent wiring will be completed soon. (Outside Contractor) The old courtyard lights have been disconnected and removed.

ALMOST COMPLETE Outdoor Sanctuary & Walkway Lights: The lights outside the sanctuary and at the walkway by the parking lot have been rewired to work with new walkway lights. Some minor detail work is still needed, but they are all in service. (Outside Contractor)

COMPLETE

Playground Cleanup: The fence and borders are down, and once the ground dries up a bit more, the rubber mulch will be removed. The area will be filled with fresh soil, and sod will be laid in preparation for the new playground equipment. *Help will be needed to spread the soil and lay the sod.*

Playground Equipment: The equipment has been purchased and is being stored in Clint Myers barn. Once the new sod takes hold, this equipment will be installed. Plans are underway for this work.

PROGRESSING Harvey Repairs: Most of the repairs are being completed by Castle Construction. These primarily include repairs to sheetrock in the education building and sanctuary. Other items, such as replacing the damaged door on the south end of the education building, and removing the skylights and re-roofing the office building will also be done. (Outside Contractor)

IMPORTANT Door Handles & Keys: New handles will be installed on the Fellowship Hall, education building and exterior parlor door. New keys will issued for all doors.

Courtyard Fencing: The wooden portion of the courtyard fence will be replaced with iron fencing. This will include a matching handrail on the steps of the walkway going to the sanctuary that will extend to the brick pillars. A cost estimate has been requested. (Outside Contractor)

Landscaping: The diseased sago palms have been removed, and the courtyard landscaping will be updated. There will also be landscaping added to the highway side of the office building and sanctuary. Bids are being obtained for bi-weekly lawn service. *Ideas and help will be needed for these projects.*

Education Building: Two rooms currently used for miscellaneous storage will be cleaned out. Broken and unwanted items will be hauled off. The rest will be organized so that they can be accessed when needed. The baseboards and trim in the hallways will be sanded down and prepped for painting. *Help will be needed for these projects.*

EXIT & Emergency Lighting: New EXIT signs with emergency lighting have been purchased and will be installed in the sanctuary and education building. (Outside Contractor)

Just like our homes, continuous repairs and improvements are required to maintain our physical assets. Please help where your time, skills and abilities allow.
