

Greetings all!

Here's a little info on something I'm working on. I'm participating in a class exploring ways in which the church can be relevant and part of the community. Things have changed so much in the past 4 years. Changes were occurring before Covid. It seems that after Covid the changes are more pronounced. The title of the class is 'Funding Forward' with the first section called 'Buildings: Burden or Blessing.' I find it very interesting, thought provoking and helpful.

One concept that we are exploring is how to align mission and money. We are invited to consider that maybe some ministries need to be released so we can focus on other ministries that are more helpful now. That is a tough one. How does one move from one good thing that is no longer helpful to something else that is now more in keeping with our journey? Grief and fear are part of the process, and yet we are called to move forward.

The following statement resonated with me: "Tithing and offering are no longer the model sustainable ministry." The conversation revolves around the decline of membership and the upkeep of buildings. The membership can be very generous but still not be able to support the ministry. This is where new income sources are helpful to explore. Here at Salem that might mean seeking ways to rent out space in our Fellowship Hall.

I have no idea how all this will play out, but I hope you will join me in the process of seeing what God is calling us to do. As we look to the future and talk about the upcoming ministry spending, I ask that you consider what things might we need to let go of so that we can grab onto what Jesus is putting before us.

Please do NOT include toothpaste, liquids of any kind and NO food. Apparently different countries have different shipping rules.

The boxes are due Nov. 17, 2024.

School supplies are in plentiful supply now. There are so many neat items available. The main items needed in each box are notebook paper, pencils, pencil sharpeners, erasers, pens, crayons, markers, mini-staplers, staples, ruler, glue stick, notepads, highlighters, school scissors, paper clips, and composition books. All children need these supplies. Some are able to go to school for the first time because these items were in their shoebox. We take crayons for granted, but in other countries, crayons are very expensive. Most families cannot afford to buy them, so please include a box in your shoebox. Shipping is \$10.00 per box. You may donate money for shipping if you wish.

It is a lot of fun to go shopping for these items and know they are appreciated and needed.

Approval of Minutes from previous meeting: Dottie moved to approve, Dave seconded, motion passed to approve April minutes. There was no meeting in May due to the absence of a quorum. Because of the annual congregational meeting, there was no monthly council meeting in January, therefore, no minutes to approve for January.

Reports:

Treasurer: Still within budget. However, had a higher expense month due to the purchase of office supplies, annual payroll subscription and purchase of alter care items.

Pastor: Submitted as information.

Proclaim: Nothing to report.

Nurture: Discussed possibilities of joining with another church

for VBS next year.

Response: Nothing to report.

Property: The exterior of the education building, office building

and fellowship hall will be painted.

Old Business: None.

New Business:

- The blessing of the backpacks will be in August, for school starts on August 14.
- Discussed getting children together for 1st communion, becoming acolytes, and giving Bible gifts.

- Discussed getting a Knox Box (lock box with keys) which allows fire and law enforcement agencies immediate access into buildings during emergencies.
- · The church has renewed its property insurance.
- Discussed creating a hurricane preparedness team; need to check on current plywood or obtaining plywood for windows.
- Pastor explained the need for a mobile phone for the office because of the internet and the need for 2 factor authentication.
- The 2024 upgrade for QuickBooks is over \$1000.00. It now requires an annual subscription. Discussed the purchase of this subscription by using money from the MI Memorial Fund that has not been used in many years by creating a new line item under office supplies for software.
 - Lindsey moved and Eddie seconded, motion passed for authority to create a line item under office supplies for software and move money from MI Living Memorial Fund to allow for purchase of the QuickBooks upgrade.
- The Councilperson schedule for July December will be updated and emailed to council members.
- Discussed having the church roof looked at and possibly putting an insurance claim in for hail damage to roof due to shingles being found on the ground.

Adjournment: Dorothy moved to adjourn, Pastor seconded, motion passed and closed with the Lord's Prayer.


